We currently have an opportunity for a **Senior Clinical Psychologist** to join our Professional Supports team. This position is 30 hours per week.

As a Senior Clinical Psychologist you will:

- Provide clinical services (assessment, individual, and group therapy) to a caseload of clients with developmental disabilities.
- Work as part of a multidisciplinary team, liaising with other professionals as required.
- Provide consultation to staff teams regarding supporting their clients.
- Participate in interagency initiatives that support complex needs clients and their caregivers.
- Supervise graduate level practicum students and provisional psychologists.
- Oversee client risk management, specifically the approval of planned approaches designed to address behaviours or situations of concern.
- Provide presentations on a variety of topics to supporters of persons with developmental disabilities.
- Participate in initial planning and intake for new clients to Vecova as requested.

The successful candidate will have outstanding interpersonal skills with a strong client and quality service focus, strong mental health and behavioral management skills, have experience working with persons with developmental disabilities and a desire to mentor other clinicians.

Qualifications:

- Registered as a psychologist and in good standing with the College of Alberta Psychologists for at least 5 years.
- Minimum of 5 years relevant clinical experience in the areas of individual psychotherapy, consultation, and behavior management.
- Working knowledge of the current predominant diagnostic classification systems and approaches to treatment.
- Experience working with individuals with developmental or other disabilities.
