Applications are being accepted for a **tenure track Academic Programming Appointment** at the **Assistant Professor rank as Director of the University of Saskatchewan Psychology Clinic (USPC)** in clinical psychology effective **July 1, 2017**.

Applicants with interests in **any area of clinical psychology** are invited to apply. The **tenure track Clinic Director** position is an exciting opportunity for someone who has a passion for the teaching and training of clinical psychology doctoral students and for clinical work with a vision to lead a community-based clinic.

We have a vibrant clinical training program with numerous scientist-practitioners. The environment is well suited to provide the Clinic Director with opportunities and support for the Clinic Director's engagement in collaborative research and scholarly work linked to clinical service delivery. The Clinic Director will be a full member of the Clinical Psychology Executive and will have the same opportunities for student research supervision as other faculty. The Clinic Director will have classroom teaching duties related to the Graduate Program in Clinical Psychology and will be instrumental in the clinical supervision and teaching of students completing practicum placements through the University of Saskatchewan Psychology Clinic. Finally, the clinic director's responsibilities will relate to the management of the University of Saskatchewan Psychology Clinic, such as generating long-term planning for growth and sustainability of the clinic; administrative management of the clinic; and liaising with community agencies to develop a client base.

We are committed to hiring outstanding scientist-practitioners who can make significant contributions to the teaching, evidence-based clinical training, and applied research/scholarly missions of the Clinical Psychology stream and the Department of Psychology as a whole. The Clinic Director would be committed to interdisciplinarity with an ability to forge productive links with other areas of professional practice on campus and in the community.

Requirements for the position include:

1. Completed Ph.D. or Psy.D. with specialization in clinical psychology, which includes completion of an accredited (or equivalent) predoctoral residency
2. Eligibility to readily obtain doctoral level registration with the Saskatchewan College of Psychologists (R.D. Psych) which includes the Authorized Practice Endorsement (APE) to provide mental health diagnoses
3. Evidence of effectiveness in clinical training, clinical supervision, and applied research

The Department's Graduate Program in Clinical Psychology is a well-established scientist-practitioner program that is fully accredited by the Canadian Psychological Association.
