Tenure Stream Position in Clinical Psychology – 1701388

The Department of Psychology at the University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) invites applications for a tenure-stream appointment in Clinical Psychology. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor and will commence on July 1, 2018.

The successful candidate must have a PhD in Clinical Psychology from an accredited clinical training program by the time of appointment or shortly thereafter. Preference will be given to applicants from a CPA/APA approved clinical psychology program. The candidate should also be eligible or currently registered as a clinical psychologist with the College of Psychologists of Ontario.

The successful candidate will be expected to conduct innovative research at the highest international level and establish an outstanding, externally funded research program. They must have an emerging record of scholarly accomplishments and will provide evidence of excellence in research as demonstrated by publications in top ranked and field relevant academic journals or a research pipeline that is at high international levels, presentations at significant conferences, and strong endorsements by referees of high international standing. The candidate must also have a commitment to excellence in teaching. This can be demonstrated by strong endorsements from referees, a teaching portfolio including excellent course evaluations and a coherent statement of teaching philosophy that is linked to evidence of excellent pedagogical practice, or demonstrated excellent performance in other teaching related activities, including performance as a teaching assistant, experience leading successful workshops or seminars, or excellent conference posters or presentations. The successful candidate will provide evidence of readiness to undertake undergraduate and graduate research supervision and teaching. The successful candidate will be expected to perform standard professional and administrative activities typical of a department and/or university. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The appointment is at the University of Toronto Scarborough, which is a research-intensive institution with an interdisciplinary commitment, a multicultural student body, and a modern campus. The University offers the opportunity to conduct research, teach, and live in one of the most diverse cities in the world. The successful candidate will be a member of the UTSC Graduate Department of Psychological Clinical Science (www.utsc.utoronto.ca/psych/clinical-psychology).
