

Tenure-Track Position in Social Psychology (Brock University, Canada)

The Department of Psychology at Brock University, St. Catharines, Ontario, Canada invites applications for a probationary tenure-track position in Social Psychology (social cognition/attitudes) at the rank of Assistant Professor to commence July 1, 2018.

Our ideal candidate will have an outstanding record of research achievement using experimental research approaches; have demonstrated evidence of, or potential for, external research funding; be committed to open and reproducible science; be committed to undergraduate and graduate teaching in both foundational and specialized areas of Social and Personality Psychology; and have a strong commitment to undergraduate mentoring and graduate student training at both the MA and PhD levels.

The Psychology Department is among the 5 most productive and impactful Psychology departments in Canada (Carleton et al., 2010; Farrell et al., 2016). Our graduate program has three foci: Behavioural and Cognition Neuroscience, Lifespan Development, and Social Personality. Applicants should have a completed Ph.D. in Psychology and submit a letter of application, a curriculum vitae, statements of research interests and teaching philosophy, recent reprints, and evidence of teaching performance, all in electronic format (a single PDF document is preferred), to psychposition@brocku.ca.
