The Educational Psychologist will be expected to demonstrate an enthusiasm for learning and the professional demeanor and flexibility required to work with adults in a consultative and facilitative manner.

The successful applicant must have completed a School Psychology program attaining a minimum of a Master's Degree and be a member in good standing, or be eligible to be a member of the British Columbia Association of School Psychologists or the British Columbia College of Psychologists.
