The Director coordinates student counselling for critical incidents and emergency situations and may be consulted about counselling and debriefing support for staff and faculty in the immediate aftermath of campus critical incidents. The primary role of the Director is to lead the provision of effective, timely and accountable professional counselling support which helps students realize, develop, and fulfill their personal and academic potential in order to maximally benefit from their University experience.

To be considered for this opportunity, you will possess:

A Doctorate in Clinical or Counselling Psychology or related discipline, registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario, or other closely related discipline is required. In addition, the successful incumbent will possess a minimum of 7 to 10 years of relevant clinical experience, preferably in a post-secondary setting, with a minimum of 3 years of management experience is required. Expertise in providing appropriate psychological interventions, knowledge of relevant legislation (ex. Human Rights) and standards of practice of the profession of Psychology.
