Your Opportunity:

The Glenrose Rehabilitation Hospital (GRH) is the largest free-standing, comprehensive tertiary rehabilitation hospital in Canada, serving patients of all ages who require complex rehabilitation to enable them to participate in life to the fullest. This advanced level Clinical Psychologist II position works within the Tertiary Children and Adolescent Mental Health outpatient clinics and inpatient units at the GRH. The position involves provision of advanced psychosocial intervention utilizing a variety of treatment modalities (individual, family, groups) to children, adolescents and their families experiencing significant mental health difficulties. Working both independently and as a member of a collaborative multidisciplinary team, you will provide evidence informed and best practices in tertiary assessment, consultation, referral, case management and treatment. This is a unique opportunity to work alongside psychiatrists, school and clinic nurses, and allied health staff.

The position will provide education and consultation to the interprofessional team and patients/families, and supervision of doctoral level psychology residents, masters level interns, provisionally registered psychologists and team members. The Psychologist II will also provide clinical practice leadership in their work and through supporting others in program development, service planning, staff development, quality improvement and evaluation, and/ or research activities as identified by the needs of the service areas. Currently this role has supported education for psychiatry residents and has been an adjunct position with the Psychiatry Department at the University of Alberta.

Job Description:

As a Psychologist II, you will provide advanced clinical services (including psychological assessment, diagnosis and/or intervention), consultation and education to the interprofessional team and patients/families, and/or provides clinical leadership and coordination in an assigned program area. This is an advanced level psychology position that will allow you to work with or within teams to provide and inform services for patients with complex and multi-dimensional medical, psychological, interpersonal, environmental and/or instrumental needs. You will consult, collaborate, and enact initiatives to ensure that practices are evidence based and in alignment with psychology standards of practice and code of

ethics, as well as policy, legislation and regulations. You will be expected to lead, facilitate and/or participate in program, policy, and procedure development, service planning, staff development, quality improvement and evaluation, and/or research activities as identified by the needs of the service area(s). You may provide supervision to doctoral level psychology residents, master's level interns, provisional psychologists, psychometrists and other team members.

Qualifications:

- Completion of doctoral degree in Psychology in an applied area relevant to the practice setting from a Canadian Psychological Association (CPA) or American Psychological Association (APA) program.
- An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.
- Active or eligible for registration with the College of Alberta Psychologists (CAP).
- Registered with the College of Alberta Psychologist (CAP), prior to the commencement in the position.

- Strong background working with parents
- Experience with current evidence based treatment in psychotherapy relative child and adolescent mental health
