Position Description:

The incumbent will provide clinical psychological services primarily to adult outpatients within Prince Albert and area. Duties will include psychological assessments and diagnosis, individual and/or group therapy, community liaison, and population education. Provision of court-ordered assessment services to youths pursuant to Section 34 of the Youth Criminal Justice Act will be required. Crisis management of individuals of all ages and provision of services to adult inpatients at the hospital will also be required. Consultation with community agencies and allied professionals is required.

Education Requirement:

- Doctoral (PH.D.) degree from an accredited university in clinical psychology; and, have/be eligible for registration with Saskatchewan College of Psychologists.

Experience:

- Two years post-Ph.D. experience in a mental health setting. Experience in the psychometric assessment, diagnosis and treatment of children, youth, and adults with significant mental health disorders.
- Must be a registered doctoral psychologist with Approved Practice Endorsement in good standing with the Saskatchewan College of Psychologists. If currently registered as a doctoral psychologist in another jurisdiction, be eligible for registration as a psychologist with the Saskatchewan College of Psychologists.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Demonstrated ability to undertake the selection, administration and interpretation of a variety of psychological tests and the ability to prepare psychological reports.
- Demonstrated ability to provide treatment services to individuals utilizing a variety of evidence based intervention modalities.
- Ability to liaise and consult with other mental health professionals and with staff or community agencies to ensure case coordination and provide training.
- Ability to provide public education on a variety of topics related to the mental health field.
- Ability to work as a member of a multi-disciplinary team or independently as required.
- Strong interpersonal and computer skills.
- Ability to communicate clearly through written, electronic and verbal mediums.
- Knowledge of community outpatient and inpatient delivery systems.
- Knowledge of cross-cultural issues and cultural sensitivity.
